Due to unforeseen circumstances, Covid to be precise, the curation has taken more than 4 years. However, there have been unexpected benefits, in that we have been able to track down other rare and purportedly lost works which have enabled us to present a more complete and at times, surprising perspective on Geoffrey's work.

Geoffrey Key is an important and highly distinctive artist, as well as a great friend, so it seemed fitting to further mark the occasion by commissioning a book and a film to document Geoffrey's highly individual artistic journey.

Preface

In a career spanning over sixty years Geoffrey Key, one of Britain's most popular and distinctive artists, has created diverse and highly original works of art. He has followed an idiosyncratic creative path and gone to extraordinary lengths to fashion his own particular artistic signature.

The road he has travelled to achieve this included, when already a successful artist, spending a complete year in the painting over and over again of one hill – the Nab, in an attempt to erase his early influences, a feat of individuality mirrored by his subsequent refusal to follow contemporary fashions in art. The dramatic and surprising significance of this daring experiment and the metamorphosis it engendered are writ large throughout the exhibition.

This almost 'Taoist' approach has resulted in both unexpected consequences and a highly distinctive style based on a fusion of line, tone and colour melded by hardwon painterly craft. There are influences, Cubism being a notable one, but the work itself cannot be bracketed by any label. This, of course, will not be 'news' to his legion of admirers but the range of work in this exhibition may, I suspect, deliver surprises even to some of these.

The 'Key Decades' exhibition is the first full retrospective of these sixty-three years, enabling a comprehensive appreciation of three of the most arresting aspects of Geoffrey Key's artistic journey: the continuous development of his distinctive style through line, tone and colour, his interpretation of a particular subject, a single topic which he paints in series, and his constant circling back to re-invent previous themes. However, 'caveat emptor', the journey is far from over.

There are few artists with whom particular artistic tropes are associated as being peculiarly their own original trademarks but with Key there are several, such as his human forms all bearing the impression of his 'Nab' period or his trademark 'Keysian' clouds. In the 'Key Decades' exhibition the ever shifting form of these signatures and their development may be followed decade by decade.

That this is possible is down to an almost forensic feat of detective work undertaken by Matthew Leech and Ella Pemberton of Cheshire Art Gallery. In this, if in nothing else, the recent pandemic has proved an unexpected bonus, in that it led to Geoffrey's 'Isolated Heads' series and afforded more time to track down several rare early works, some of which had been previously considered lost.

Perhaps it is some of these which will surprise even the most ardent Key aficionados, as they challenge the orthodox opinion on the Geoffrey Key cannon. The care and passion with which the exhibition has been curated extends to the commissioning of an accompanying book, providing a critical analysis of Geoffrey's life and work and a film in which Geoffrey talks candidly about his journey as an artist.



Standing Woman

'Standing Woman' exactly captures a mood of pensive reflection tinged with melancholy in a work of delicate beauty. But look again and wonder how the artist achieves this, it is more abstract than figurative and borrows heavily from Geoffrey's cubist influences. The stomach is distorted and displaced, the shoulders are misaligned, the heavy limbs bear their 'Nab' origin whilst the powerful column of the neck ends in the delicate minimalism of the face. Described as such it sounds a mess and yet in the artists hands it is a work of sensitive beauty and grace.





Both the above paintings exemplify the artist's ability to impart a subject's essence in the way a literal portrayal could not. In 'Self Portrait', the thick swirling brush strokes create an air of pensive restlessness, suggesting an artist wrestling with the questions his art poses. 'Manchester Street Scene', with its teasing subtle cubism, grants us a definite feel of the place without us actually seeing anything concrete. Shapes swirl and shift aided and abetted by the subtle, fluctuating greys and blues, nothing fully








Prodigal Son

The Prodigal Son is one of the pieces with which the exhibition challenges the orthodox view of Geoffrey Key's art. This is an unusual early piece, portraying a group of bulky figures who are gathered in a group in a flat, desert landscape. The colours are not at all what we expect from an early Key. The predominate colour is a vivid orange which merges in to a lighter, ochre sky. This work stands out almost as an outlier, pointing the way to later works both in the brilliance of the hues but also in tone and in the composition and heft of the figures. It effectively makes the point that even in his early years, it is a mistake to attempt to bracket Geoffrey's work. The range and variety has always been there.

The Prodigal Son featured in Geoffrey's first solo exhibition curated by the Salford Art Gallery and Museum, it had in fact been sold prior to the exhibition in 1966 and up until its recent discovery had remained, below the radar, unseen. It is the largest painting in the exhibition.



Horse and Rider

A fascinating and historic work, this sculpture from 1963 was the focal point of Geoffrey Key's post graduate degree and as a consequence is accompanied by a series of, rare, preliminary sketches giving us an insight into its aspirations and development.

Key wanted to work in three dimensions, not only to work with different materials but also to give depth, or in his own words, 'a sense of what lies behind the surface' to his painting. There is a feel of movement and tension in this piece caused in part by the differing angles of the horse and rider. This is particularly acute at the point where the rider has to adjust his posture as the horse lowers its neck to graze. 'Horse and Rider' was sold early as Geoffrey had no space to store it and it was believed to have disappeared, so we are fortunate that it has been tracked down and brought to light once again.



Still Life 1959

This is a particularly interesting painting unearthed and acquired, through detective work, for the exhibition. Still Life 1959 is unusual, being oil on blackout curtain. The latter was provided by Geoffrey's mother, Marion, and had to be stretched by hand onto a picture frame.

It was the first Key painting ever to be sold and given its ad hoc construction is a most unusual, if not unique exhibit. Look at the patina of the paint for hints of the unusual background. A particularly mature study for one so young whose talent was recognised, even in those early years.

Key Decades: The Book

For an artist of Geoffrey Key's stature, it is highly surprising there has never been a biographical and artistic critical study in book form. This is largely explained by Geoffrey's reluctance to engage with the media and its mores. He has preferred to release books on varying aspects of his art with text by his wife, Judith O'Leary, and more recently the 'Isolated Heads' book which covers his work throughout the pandemic.

Key Decades is, therefore, the first full treatment of his life and oeuvre. It includes the fruits of a series of conversations held with the author over a period of four years. In these, Geoffrey 'opens up' and talks candidly about his life, artistic philosophy, influences and the manner in which his painting has evolved.


Geoffrey's is a fascinating story, bookended by the aftermath of the Second World war and the ongoing pandemic, tracing the development of a highly individual artistic style during the most rapid period of change the world has seen. Key's, at times Rabelaisian, love of life, scholarship and refusal to compromise his artistic integrity shines through it all.

Lavishly illustrated, the book is offered in two editions.



We live in a throw-away world of social media influencers earning fame and money by urging us to acquire whatever is currently en vogue but will soon be worthless, inviting us to experience a series of sugar-rush pleasures that may give us a fleeting sense of being part of whatever is deemed to be fashionable. We live with news-bites and instant opinions, governed by a market sufficiently sophisticated to move us remorselessly onto the next thing before, moments later, we throw it away.

Geoffrey's life as an artist spans a period of considerable change, beginning with post war austerity then taking in the surge towards freedom and youth culture of the sixties, economic and social disorder, war, the restructuring of world order, pandemic and lockdown. It will be interesting to see how long the current phase of obsession with personal identity and its concomitant cancel culture lasts.

Whatever the answer it won't change the integrity of the way Geoffrey works any more than its predecessor fads managed to. In fact, I shouldn't imagine Geoffrey would even notice were he to be cancelled.

What a pleasure therefore to be able to spend time with the beauty of something hard won, impossible to imitate and constantly renewing and progressing, something that has endured and will continue to delight and surprise us. Something to cherish. Geoffrey Key.
